Pirate Varsity volleyball finished their season Tuesday night in the first round of state playoffs vs Ardrey Kell High school. The Pirates have 6 seniors graduating this year including: Savannah McIntosh, Shannon Brewer, Jenna Sadler, Daisy Henson, Jordyn Long and Maddie Goodman. The team finished 11-3 in the regular season and 11-4 overall, claiming second place in the SW4A conference. Congratulations to Megan Brandon being named to the SW4A All Conference Team and Savannah McIntosh being named SW4A Player of the Year! Notable stats from this season include: Senior Savannah McIntosh clenching the State 4A title of most serving aces at 70, and most assists on the team at 316. Sophomore Megan Brandon led the team with most kills at 115, and most blocks at 23, with Freshman Lindsey Love with most digs at 169. The Pirates are led by former PRHS alum, Coach Heather Welch who just finished her third season as head coach.
