To try out for a Winter Sport, you must get a TRYOUT TICKET from the Athletic
Director BEFORE THE TRYOUT DATE AND TIME.

To receive a TRYOUT TICKET, the following must be completed:

- Online FamilyID Registration completed by athlete's parent or guardian using the following link: https://www.ucpsathletics.com/eligibility
- Submit the 2019-2020 UCPS Eligibility Packet to the Athletic Director.
 Note: If you had a Novant physical on June 1, 2019 or your physical is valid (within the last 395 days) and on file with us, there is no need to submit a new one. Check with your coach to see if it is valid. All rising 9th graders will need to submit a physical. Physicals are not transferred over from the middle school.
- FamilyID registration must be approved by the athletic director.
- IF you tried out or are playing on a Fall Sports team, you must still get a Winter Tryout Ticket, but you DO NOT need to register again.

TRYOUT TICKET Dates:

Tryout tickets will be given out on the following dates during ALL LUNCHES. Parents or guardians must pre-register online. Athletes cannot register themselves.

Prospective candidates who plan to major in a STEM or education discipline at NC State and reside in a North Carolina household with a pre-tax annual gross income (AGI) of less than \$110,000 are eligible to potentially receive an invitation to apply to the Goodnight Scholars Program's Class of 2024. Information from our CTE Department.

"Career of the Week - Architect"

An architect is a person who plans and designs houses, factories, office buildings, and other structures. Typically an architect meets with clients to determine what needs to be built and what the requirements are for the building, work either on a computer or draw by hand a scale of the building, make sure building contractors have the contracts, visit worksites to make sure the builders are following their architectural plans, etc. Most architects earn their professional degree through a 5-year Bachelor of Architecture degree program, as well as, earn a master's degree in architecture. All states require architects to be licensed, which typically includes completing a professional degree in architecture, gaining relevant experience through a paid internship, and passing the Architect Registration Examination. Architects average salary for the state of North Carolina is \$78,660 and \$76,930 for the nation.
