Put first things first!
Prioritize!

- We want you to remember that when you turn 17.5 to 18, it's the law that you register with Selective Service. Registration with Selective Service is your civic responsibility and keeps you eligible for student loans, job training, government jobs, and driver's licenses in most states. Get a Selective Service registration card at your local post office or register online at www.ss.gov. You can even register with your smart phones. If you have any questions regarding registration, talk to Mr. James. He's your Selective Service Registrar
- Students, apply for a FREE trip to Washington, DC. The NC Electric and Union Power Cooperatives will be selecting three High school juniors to receive a one week all-expense paid trip to Washington DC with 1,800 student from across the nation. Deadline to apply is December 31, 2019. Find more information [here](#).
- Prospective candidates who plan to major in a STEM or education discipline at NC State and reside in a North Carolina household with a pre-tax annual gross income (AGI) of less than \$110,000 are eligible to potentially receive an invitation to apply to the Goodnight Scholars Program's Class of 2024. - We do NOT send ACT/SAT test scores to colleges. You have to have your test scores sent through the testing agencies. For those of you who only took the ACT that was given during the school day you need to create an online account. I have attached a document on how to create the account.
