#### Major Scholarships

Students complete an application and our school scholarship committee, consisting of school counselors, an administrator and teachers, reviews the applications of students and chooses our school nominee(s). The student(s) selected as our school nominee then applies directly to the institution for the larger competition.

#### "Career of the Week – Diagnostic Medical Sonographer"

A Diagnostic Medical Sonographer specializes in creating images of the body's organs and tissues. They tend to work closely with physicians or surgeons before, during, and after medical procedures. Some of their job duties include, reviewing images or test results to check quality and adequate coverage of the areas needed for diagnoses, analyze diagnostic information to provide a summary of findings to doctors, and record findings and keep track of patients' records. Abdominal, Breast, Musculoskeletal, Pediatric, Obstetric and Gynecologic Sonographers are some of the different types of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers. To become a Diagnostic Medical Sonographer, one needs some formal education, such as an associate's degree or a postsecondary certificate and most employers prefer graduates of programs accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP). Diagnostic Medical Sonographer's average salary for the state of North Carolina is \$63,860 and \$69,650 for the nation. Employment of a Diagnostic Medical Sonographer is projected to grow 26% from 2014 to 2024.
