To receive a TRYOUT TICKET, the following must be completed:

- Online FamilyID Registration completed by athlete's parent or guardian using the following link: https://www.ucpsathletics.com/eligibility
- Submit the 2019-2020 UCPS Eligibility Packet to the Athletic Director.
 Note: If you had a Novant physical on June 1, 2019 or your physical is valid (within the last 395 days) and on file with us, there is no need to submit a new one. Check with your coach to see if it is valid. All rising 9th graders will need to submit a physical. Physicals are not transferred over from the middle school.
- FamilyID registration must be approved by the athletic director.
- IF you tried out or are playing on a Fall Sports team, you must still get a Winter Tryout Ticket, but you DO NOT need to register again.



Prospective candidates who plan to major in a STEM or education discipline at NC State and reside in a North Carolina household with a pre-tax annual gross income (AGI) of less than \$110,000 are eligible to potentially receive an invitation to apply to the **Goodnight Scholars Program's Class of 2024**. Major Scholarships





"Career of the Week - Automotive-Master Technician"

Automotive service technicians and mechanics inspect, maintain, and repair cars and light trucks. Some of the things service technicians do are to identify problems, plan work procedures, test parts and systems, etc. Because of the growing number of electronic systems in automobiles, service technicians must not only be familiar with the traditional mechanical systems, but the electronic systems as well. Most employers looking to hire an automotive service technician would prefer they complete a formal training program at a postsecondary institution, but is not required, and once employed, an industry certification is usually required. The courses students take in high school, such as, automotive repair, electronics, computers, and mathematics provide for a good background for a prospective service technician. Automotive Technicians salary for the state of North Carolina can range from \$21,270 to \$63,250 and \$23,420 to \$66,950 for the nation.
