



Join Us For Rea View's First Ever Parent-Faculty Book Club!

We decided it would be powerful to read a book together on this topic. Our thought was that if we read together as a group, we will have common language and a shared vision for how to support and connect with our children to help them learn and, more importantly, *thrive*. This book is perfect for a parent-faculty book club because it also focuses on how to “take care” of our educators, who have one of the most significant connection points to our children.

The plan is to read the book in its entirety and at your own pace from now through October 17th.
