### FIRST SEMESTER FINAL EXAM INFORMATION

### **EXAMS BEGIN THURSDAY, JANUARY 18TH**

### Important Testing Reminders:

- Be on time! The building is open to students at 7:15am each morning.
- Students must be in their testing locations by 8:15 am. Students arriving late will not be admitted to exams once testing has begun.
- As a reminder, final exams count as 25% of the overall semester grade. Attendance is very important.
- Students will need their laptops and their chargers each day and a calculator if taking an exam where it is permitted.
- All students are encouraged to get a good night's sleep each night and have a healthy breakfast each morning.

Students are required to take ALL EXAMS, including End of Course (EOC) and Teacher Made exams, at school during exam week.

The following are some important reminders for all students taking an EOC, CTE, or teacher made final exam:

• Students are asked to charge their Chromebook the night before AND bring their charger with them for test day. If your students computer is broken or not working properly, please have

them contact Ms. Tammy Douglas, our Desktop Support Engineer.

- Students should bring a pencil and calculator if they have a math exam.
- Testing will begin at 8:15am on Thursday, January 18th through Tuesday, January 23rd as well as on Wednesday, January 24th for the make-up exams. All testing should be completed daily around 12:30pm. Students will not be permitted to leave campus until all exams have been completed.
- Buses will pick up at normal morning times on exam days **but will be taking students home immediately following exams during those days**. Buses will run on normal times during the make-up exam day on Wednesday, January 24th. Only students who have to take a make-up exam are required to come to school on the make-up exam day on Wednesday, January 24th.


### Absences and Teacher Made Final Exam Exemptions

Absences have an impact on whether or not a student can be exempt from a teacher made final exam. The follow excerpt outlines the requirements for teacher made final exam exemptions as is found on page 24 of the 2023-2024 UCPS High School Student Handbook which can be accessed by clicking <u>HERE</u>.

High School students will not be required to take a teacher-made final exam in a course in the following situations:

- The student has an average of 90 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 2 unexcused absences in the class; or
- The student has an average of 80 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 1 unexcused absence in the class.

# ATTENDANCE



In the event your child is absent from school due to illness/injury, please provide written documentation to our Attendance Counselor, Mrs. TC Yost (<u>tammy.yost@ucps.k12.nc.us</u>). Either a doctor's note or written parent note is required to excuse the absence. Remember, parent notes will only be accepted during the current 6-week grading period, of the absent day. For more information regarding attendance, please reference the UCPS policy found on the website

### Attendance Recovery:

An email has gone out to both parents and students regarding Attendance Recovery. Attendance Recovery must be completed before exams begin. If your student has not picked up their form showing required hours, please have them stop by the attendance office on Monday, January 8th. Thank you

### Early Dismissal Procedure:

Due to the increased number of students leaving school early, it is important that you follow the early dismissal procedures to avoid classroom interruption. On the occasions that you need your student to be dismissed early, a prior written note will be REQUIRED. The note must be brought to the front office prior to the beginning of school and should include the following information: student's first and last name, date, time of dismissal and parent signature. Following this procedure will allow the student to leave class at the assigned time without interrupting instruction.

### **Tardies**

At Weddington High School, we believe that teachers have a right to teach and students have a right to learn. Instructional time must be protected and without interruption in order to assure that quality teaching and learning are taking place in every classroom, every day. Instruction should and will be conducted from the time students enter the classroom through the time the bell rings and they are released by their teacher. At the beginning of class when the bell rings, teachers are to mark students arriving late to class tardy in PowerSchool. This applies to ALL blocks and lunches. Students missing more than 15 minutes of class, will be marked absent for the block. Keep in mind, students who leave a class should have a pass to avoid being marked incorrectly. \* The WHS tardy policy can be found in the WHS student handbook which can be accessed by clicking <u>HERE</u>.

At the beginning of each semester, student tardies will reset\*

UCPS has enabled an automated message that will go out each day to the parents of students who were tardy for one or more classes that day.

# **COUNSELING DEPARTMENT**

### Second Semester Begins Friday, January 26th

Students will follow their 2nd semester schedule beginning Friday, January 26th. Students are asked to review their schedule prior to semester 1 exams. Student schedules are available via PowerSchool. Paper copies of second semester schedules <u>will not</u> be distributed. If a student has a hole in their second semester schedule, students are asked to see a counselor during the student's lunch block (not during class) to select a course.

### Semester 2 - Schedule Change Request

Spring semester schedule change requests can be submitted beginning at **3:00pm on Friday**, **January 26th through Friday, February 2nd at 8:00am** by completing the schedule change request form which can be accessed via the school counseling webpage or by clicking <u>HERE</u>. Please note, requests through this form cannot be made until 3:00pm on Friday January 26th.

- 1. Schedule change requests can be submitted the first 5 days of semester 2.
- 2. ONLY requests submitted via the schedule change request form will be considered.
- 3. Requests sent via email and/or voicemail will NOT be considered.
- 4. Please know submitting this form does NOT guarantee a schedule change.
- 5. Do not submit this form if you do not want the order of your current schedule to change as this is a possibility.
- 6. Check PowerSchool often to identify if a modification to your schedule has been made.
- 7. Schedule changes are made in real time therefore a list of options cannot be made available.

### Class of 2024 - Midyear Transcript / Midyear Report/ Midyear Grades - Request

Not all colleges/universities require a midyear transcript/midyear report. Check your email, review admissions pages, and login to your college portals to identify if this documentation is required. This <u>https://forms.gle/VosLSBxN8ygwqDzWA</u> should only be completed for those schools requesting or requiring a midyear transcript/midyear report.

Once Semester 1 exams have concluded and grades are finalized, the District will load final Semester 1 transcripts. This process could take up to 3 days. Please allow 2 weeks for transcripts to be submitted.

Only midyear transcripts requested via this document will be sent to colleges/universities. Email/voicemail requests will not be processed.

# New Protocol for UCPS Events

This a friendly reminder that due to a number of safety incidents at athletic events around the county, UCPS implemented the protocols listed in the graphic below.

Please know that this applies to all athletic events, both indoors and outdoors, effective immediately. Please plan ahead: pre-purchase your ticket, store all bags/purses that do not meet criteria below at home, ensure there is adult supervision for children.



UCPS has experienced a number of safety incidents at athletic events around the county. For winter sports, UCPS will implement the following protocols.

- Only clear bags, no larger than 4.5" x 6.5" will be allowed in events/games. Medical and baby bags are subject to search.
- Middle and elementary students must be accompanied by an adult (21 years or older) to attend events and games.
- · All ticket sales will end at the beginning of halftime of the final event.
