Carolina's Carrousel Scholarship Program and Thanksgiving Parade

The Carolina's Carrousel Program is being run differently this year. There will be no awards ceremony, and only the scholarship winners will appear in the Thanksgiving Day Parade. Each high school in the area may nominate one senior female to compete for a spot in the Thanksgiving Day parade. If you are interested, you must submit the following information to Ms. McDonald by October 8th:

- A list of your academic and extracurricular accomplishments
- A 300-500 word essay on the following topic: "What are your dreams of the future? When you look back on your life in 30 years, what would it take for you to consider your life successful?"

The scholarship committee will choose ONE nominee. This student must be willing to provide the following **by October 15**th: 3 letters of recommendation (two from teachers or school personnel and one from a community member documenting your community service), a photo, and documentation that you have taken an SAT or ACT test. It would be a good idea to obtain those letters of recommendation now so that you are not rushing your recommenders at the time.


