Revised Student Check-In and Check-Out Procedures

In the interest of student safety, front office staff has collaborated with administration on the following process. Please read carefully and review with your student.

Check In/Check Outs:

- 1. There have been issues with students leaving based on notes and emails from parents that are not legitimate. To avoid this problem, we will call parents to confirm notes received after 8 am and any email must be confirmed with a phone call before the student can leave. Early dismissal notes should be brought to Ms. King-Pierce's office before 8 am.
- 2. We will continue having students <u>check in</u> with Ms. King-Pierce (or Mr. Honeycutt in her absence). However, students will <u>check out</u> in the Front Office only. This is to make sure there is a parent to pick the student up. Students who are driving themselves should have that indicated on the note they turn in before school, or we will follow up with a call.

<u>Calling Parents for Permission to Leave Campus:</u>

- 1. When students become ill at school, they must come to the nurse or front office with a note from a teacher to call a parent for permission to drive home.
- **2.** THE FRONT OFFICE will then make the call on behalf of the student. If the parent wants to speak with the student, the student will call using the guest phone.
- **3.** We must still request notes via email or fax from parents with permission for students to leave campus, in addition to the phone call for verification purposes.

We will review these procedures with students during school this week. Students who violate school policies will face disciplinary consequences. As always, student safety is our primary concern!

Scholarship of the Week: Emory Scholars Program & Goizueta Scholars Program (Emory University): To be considered for the Emory University Scholars Program (including the Woodruff, Oxford, and Goizueta Scholarships), students must select one of Emory's three admission decision plans (Early Decision I, Early Decision II, or Regular Decision). Students must submit all required application materials, including the additional Scholars Essay, by the November 15 Emory University Scholars Program deadline—if your selected admission plan is ED II or RD. Students applying ED I may apply for the Scholars program, but need to meet the November 1 deadline for all materials. Full instructions can be found via the "Questions" section of the Emory University supplemental "My College" page on the Common Application. Please note for the 2013-2014 application cycle, applicants no longer need to be nominated by a high school guidance / college counselor to be considered for the Emory University Scholars Program, and no additional nomination forms are required. Students can nominate themselves via their Common Application, and the only additional requirement is answering one of two Scholar essays as part of the Common Application Writing Supplement on the Emory "My College" page.
