We will be utilizing NC Virtual and Union County Virtual offerings more to assist the students with some courses second semester.

Semester Exams will be given January 13 th- January 16th, with January 17, being the make-up day. Students need to present for the exams unless they have a documented medical release or a situation beyond their control for missing the exams. Making up an exam for any reason other than those mentioned will take an Act of Congress which we prefer to avoid. The exams will count for 25% of the final grade and the exams will not be scaled. Students need to attend and take the review sessions seriously.

Important Final Exam Information from Marvin Ridge High School

Jan. 17 – Make-up Exams for Absent Students/Normal Schedule

Jan. 20 – MLK, Jr. Holiday Jan. 21 – Optional Teacher Workday Jan. 22 – Required Teacher Workday Jan. 23 – First Day of Second Semester

Type of Exams: We have four types – EOC, NC Common Exams, IMS, and Teacher-Made. Your student's teacher can address which type your student will take next month. A list of EOC courses and NC Final Exams will be posted on our website soon. IMS tests are for all CTE courses. All other exams are teacher-made.

Attendance: Attendance during exam days is required for all students, for both exam sessions and review sessions. Our normal school hours apply, but the schedule and lunch times will be adjusted. January 17 is an important day for any students who have missed an exam earlier in the week due to illness. It has been publicized for the last month that family vacation plans are not excused and that students cannot take exams early. We apologize that any requests for exceptions cannot be honored.

Testing Window: New rules from NCDPI (North Carolina Department of Public Instruction) require that testing must be completed by January 17. This is true for ALL types of exams: EOC, NC Common Exams, IMS, and Teacher-Made.

Percentage: All high school exams count 25% of a student's grade for the semester. Please emphasize this point to students and help them to recognize the opportunity of a positive outcome and the consequence of a negative one.

Exam review: All teachers are expected to help students with review during class time and to distribute a review guide to students prior to testing. Study guides will also available on teacher Moodle pages. Please look for these after winter break, but it is never too early for your student to begin organizing and reviewing material.

Academic Integrity: Please remind students of our Academic Core Values on p.5 and posted in previous editions of the Maverick Message. **The penalty for cheating of any kind is a "0" on a final exam.** Students will be required to turn in cell phones during testing sessions, and it is our strong recommendation that they are not brought to school on these days.

Your student's success is always our primary concern. Please contact the school (your child's teachers, grade level counselor, or grade level administrator) if you have an questions or concerns.

First Annual Sadie Hawkins Dance— Saturday December 14, 2013


