- All UCPS students in grades 6-12 will have a Lenovo Chromebook available for issue this school year. Teachers will utilize the new technology in classrooms and through homework this year. Your student's access will be a vital ingredient to academic success.

A \$25 technology fee will be assessed, and can be paid by cash, check, or the online payment system. NO forms or money will be accepted while the first rollout is occurring. ## Student Handbook Reminders—Please be aware of and follow the policies...

#### **Cell Phones**

(Per Union County Public Schools Policy) Except pursuant to an authorized instructional purpose and as an instructional tool under the guidance and direction of a staff member during a school activity, students will not use cellular phones, CD players, iPods, MP3 players, headphones and DVD players on campus from the first bell of the day through the last dismissal bell. Except as identified above, cell phones must be turned off and out of sight (in book bag, pocket, or purse) at all times. These items may be kept on campus in a locked vehicle without violating school policy. School is not responsible for loss or damage of any kind to the above named items.

**First Offense:** Confiscate items and return only to parents after the school day ends. If use of cell phone results in violation of other policies, including, but not limited to school based rules, further discipline may be applied.

**Second Offense:** Parent conference required and may include 1 day of In-School Suspension, After School detention, or Saturday School.

**Third Offense:** Parent conference required and may include 1 day of In-School Suspension, After School Detention, or Saturday School. The student cannot bring the item to school for the remainder of the school year, except as authorized in writing by the school principal.

\*\* PHONES WILL ONLY BE RETURNED TO PARENTS AFTER THE SCHOOL DAY ENDS.\*\*

#### **Dress code**

If a student's dress or appearance is so unusual, inappropriate, or lacking in cleanliness that it disrupts the learning environment, the student may be required to change the offending dress or appearance. Clothing that attracts undue attention to the body's form or contour is inappropriate for school. Students are responsible, therefore, for exercising good judgment in dress and grooming. Students who violate the Dress Code will report to SMC. The following are guidelines for high school dress, but are not limited to these:

Shorts, skirts, dresses, etc. must extend beyond a student's fingertips when the student is standing up straight. No holes are allowed above the fingertip length.

Shirts must cover the torso and straps must be at least 3 inches or 3 fingers wide.

No mesh tops, see-through, cut-off shirts, halters, skintight clothes, or clothing of any type that exposes the torso, profane words, drug or alcohol advertising, sexual innuendoes, or other unacceptable graphics.

Students must wear shoes.

"Drag and sag" pants violate dress code.

No gang related clothing, paraphernalia or gang related tattoos.

Visible undergarments are prohibited at all times.

No pajamas, including pajama pants, hats, or sunglasses (unless medically needed) are allowed in school.

\*The administration reserves the right to set additional dress code rules on an individual basis if the student's clothing is disruptive to the school environment.
