#### Test Scores and College Applications

Test-optional for all: Allows applicants to decide for themselves.

Test-optional for some: Might be required for certain majors (STEM, Nursing). Might not be required if you meet a GPA/Rank requirement.

Test flexible: Another test, such as an AP exam, could count as a school's test requirement for admission.

Test blind: College won't look at test scores for admission even if they are submitted.

Test optional/blind for admissions, but required for enrollment: Scores used for scholarships, course placement, etc.

Look at the colleges you're applying to and find their average score range.

If your score is comparable or higher > send it

If it's lower, consider whether it still adds to your application. If not > don't send it

Should I still take the SAT if all the colleges on my list are test optional?

Yes!

You'll keep your options open
Scores may be required for scholarships
Gives colleges more information about your academic performance

# ADMISSIONS APPLICATION OPTIONS



Early Action: Students are NOT committed to accept the college's offer of admission and may file other applications.

Early Decision: A binding commitment to a college. You are required to sign a statement agreeing to accep the college's offer of admission and withdraw your other applications. (Duke, Elon, Davidson, High Point).

Regular Admission: Deadline is usually November-February

Rolling Admission: Submit at your convenience up to a certain date. Receive your decision within 4-6 weeks.



## ADMISSIONS DECISIONS



Accepted (yay!): You'll want to investigate more about the school and wait for their financial aid package before making a decision.

Denied: a final decision by the college not to offer admission.

Deferment: They want another look in their regular decision pool of applicants. Make sure to update the school on any accomplishments, additional recommendation letters, or grade/score reports.

Waitlisted: Provide the school with similar information as for deferred schools.

### NC COLLEGE CONNECT



A new program that provides a simpler and faster way to get admitted to college

Eligibility criteria: Weighted 2.8 GPA

Meet the state graduation requirements (\*additional requirements may be needed for certain institutions)

Respond to safety questions

Students will receive a tailored list of colleges for which they meet the GPA and other requirements. This means a student may not see every participating NC College Connect college on their list.

Eligible students received a letter in the mail. Another round will go out after September 15. This round will not be mailed, but will be reflected in the student's CFNC account.

### ESSAYS

View the essay as an opportunity; it's one of the few things you have complete control over.

View it as a way to sell yourself to the admissions team

READ the prompt

Make it personal and unique

Don't make it a list of accomplishments; that's what your resume is for

**PROOFREAD** 

Optional essays are NOT optional

## LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION



Many schools require letters from teachers. You can also use counselors, coaches, managers, or other people who can speak to your character.

Be mindful of how many academic letters your school requires. Schools may only want letters from teachers and not anyone else.

Ask a teacher who knows you well and who can write about your character, strengths, and qualities.

Give your teacher AT LEAST two weeks notice

Requesting letters of recommendation through Scoir will be explained soon.

#### TRANSCRIPTS



Seniors will receive a paper copy of their transcript in advisory. Review it and make sure there are no errors.

All transcripts will be uploaded into Scoir and sent to the schools on these student's college list.

We will send three transcripts each year
Initial: All grades through end of junior year
Mid-year: All grades through end of fall semester
senior year

Final: All grades through end of senior year.

These will be given at graduation and students should mail it to their school.

Counselors will send final transcripts through Scoir later in the summer





Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be completed by all students wishing to be considered for any financial aid.



The FAFSA is a confidential document used to collect information to determine a student's need for financial aid.

The FAFSA will open on October 1.

#### SCHOLARSHIPS



Some schools have a prominent scholarship that can pay of most or all of the college expenses (Morehead-Cain, Levine, ECU Scholar, Park). These are highly competitive.

There are less competitive scholarships offered through colleges, community and national organizations, and local businesses.

Scholarship applications can sometimes be as detailed as a college application so don't wait until the last minute.

NEVER pay for scholarship information or applications.

#### SCOIR

Scoir is the system we use to send transcripts, letters of recommendation, and any other college documents.

Most students will not apply using Scoir. However, some colleges allow you to apply within Scoir.



Students will list the schools they're applying to and that is how counselors and teachers will know where to send documents.

If you are using NC College Connect do not put your schools into Scoir yet.



### SCOIR + COMMON APP





Common App Integration is now live!

Students will connect their accounts and Common App activity will sync with their My Colleges list in Scoir.

Students will do the following in Common App:
Sign FERPA Release & Waiver
Initiate Early Decision Agreements
Make Fee Waiver requests
Choose application round, and build and submit applications

Requesting letters of recommendation is still done in Scoir\*

\*Common App will not prompt students for a letter of recommendation.


However, any outside recommender needs to be requested in Common App.

#### ADDING COLLEGES TO YOUR PAGE


For non-Common App schools, you'll need to add these manually.

#### LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION



Common App schools will required the letter to be assigned to a school or schools.

\*We are still not sure how this process works; whether the student can assign it or a counselor has to do it.

For non-Common App schools they do not need to be assigned

Letters cannot be assigned and sent for Common App schools until the integration goes live.

#### LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION VS. COUNSELOR EVALUATION

A counselor evaluation is an academic snapshot of your time in high school. Not all schools require a counselor evaluation.

If a school requires a counselor evaluation, we will automatically complete it; you don't need to request this.

A recommendation is written by a teacher, coach, manager, etc. that expands on your character, achievements, and other things that colleges can't determine based on your transcript, resume, etc.

Counselors are happy to write a recommendation but please have a conversation with them first. A counselor recommendation does not take the place of an academic teacher recommendation.



This is an overview of our school. It helps colleges understand the type of school we are, how rigorous our course offerings are, and other information that is used in reviewing your application.

- ► Click Work-Based Learning link on left side
- ► Select which type of Internship you are interested in and follow prompts
  - YOU CAN APPLY FOR A FULL CREDIT/1 BLOCK CLASS INTERNSHIP
  - AN INTERNSHIP COUNTS AS A FULL CREDIT AND WILL AVERAGE INTO THE GPA
  - STUDENTS ARE PLACED IN INDUSTRY BY CTE UNLESS YOU SET UP YOUR OWN - THEN JUST NEED TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION
  - DEADLINE FOR SPRING SEMESTER INTERNSHIPS OCT. 1
  - MUST COMMIT TO 8 HOURS A WEEK
