The [American Legion Oratorical High School Scholarship Program](#) for 2025 is a public speaking contest in which high school students in grades 9-12 are judged on their knowledge and communication about the U.S. Constitution.

The local first place finisher will receive a \$50 award to help cover travel expenses to the Regional (District 17) contest on February 8, 2025 for Union, Cabarrus, and Stanly counties. The winner advances to the regional, then perhaps state and even national competitions. Scholarship awards at higher levels of competition range from a few hundred dollars to \$25,000 for the national first-place finisher.

Who should apply:

Students interested in government or civic organizations and that plan to study social sciences, history, and perhaps law as undergraduates and beyond. Good communication skills are a definite plus.
