





Your Senior Year

- Make a plan for starting your senior year strong academically and with your extracurricular activities.
- Use the Naviance platform to build a resume if you don't already have one.
- August college applications will open (ONLINE)
- We will share information during your registration meeting about how you will use your Naviance account during the college application season
- The earliest college application deadlines will begin in mid-October.
- Completed applications include:
 - Application, Essays, Transcript, ACT/SAT Scores, recommendations, school reports
- Pay attention to deadlines!
 - Meeting early deadlines may help you qualify for scholarships
- Begin searching for scholarship opportunities early!
- Meetings next fall: Senior Night in early September, Individual Senior meetings September-October, Financial Aid night early October

COLLEGE PLACEMENT TESTS

- Most students take the SAT / ACT the fall and/or spring of their junior year. Prep classes are available online and through private providers. Target scores are school specific.
- To register for the SAT, you must go to collegeboard.org
- To register for the ACT, you must go to <u>act.org</u>.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - COURSES

English	4 Credits: I, II, III, IV
Math	4 Credits: Math I, Math II, Math III and a 4th Math Course to be aligned with the student's post high school plans
Science	3 Credits: A Physical Science course, Biology, Earth/Environmental Science
	SC schools require a third lab science (Lab Sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Anatomy, Marine Science, Forensics, AP Sciences)
Social Studies	4 Credits: World History, Civics and Economics, American History 1, American History 2
Second Language	Not required for graduation. However, 2 levels of the same language required to meet minimum application requirements for UNC schools.
Health/PE	1 Credit Health/Physical Education
Electives	2 Credits in Art, CTE or World Language + 4 additional electives. SC schools require a Fine Arts class (visual arts, theatre, or chorus)

NC ACADEMIC SCHOLARS

NC Academic Scholars is a recognition that you may receive upon graduation.

Students must have an overall four year unweighted GPA of 3.5 and complete certain courses to qualify.

You should <u>not</u> have taken any required classes on a Pass/Fail basis.

Please see your <u>Program of Studies</u> to access the NCAS requirements for your class.

PASS/FAIL

- Students will be permitted to enroll in one (1) elective course per school year on a Pass/Fail basis.
- Students must decide within the first ten days if the course is to be taken on a Pass/Fail basis.
- Should a student earn a mark of F in a Pass/Fail course, the grade will be calculated in the student's GPA, class rank and maximum potential.
- North Carolina Academic Scholars may not enroll in a required course on Pass/Fail basis.

ACADEMIC DIFFICULTY OF COURSES

- •Level 1: College Prep (CP) Course content, pace, and academic rigor follows standards specified by the North Carolina Standard Course of Study (NCSCOS) with content enrichment where appropriate.
- •Level 2: Honors, Some CCP Course content, pace, and academic rigor place high expectations on the student and surpass standards specified by the NCSCOS. These courses demand greater independence and responsibility than Level 2 courses. This level or higher is suggested for competitive college admission.
- •Level 3: Advanced Placement, IB, CCP College Transfer Pathway— Course content, pace, and academic rigor are college-level as adopted by the College Board, International Baccalaureate Organization. These course may lead to college credit.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

- This year we are registering on the registration cards
 AND in the PowerSchool system again.
- You will make your selections on your registration card and then transfer them to the online registration system.
- Additional 4 year course planner in Canvas

REGISTRATION CARDS

- The registration card includes core and elective classes:
- Select 8 classes by marking an X by the course.
- Select at least 4 alternates but no more than 6 alternates by marking an "A" by the course.
 Remember to select carefully, since these may be courses that you will actually be scheduled for.

WAIVERS

As you are selecting your courses, you will have the option of selecting CP, Honors, or AP courses. If you want to take a class on a level that you were not recommended for, you will need to complete a waiver. This waiver will require a parent/guardian's permission to take the advanced course.

Waivers are available on the <u>school website</u>. Hard copies are available in the counseling office.

A Day/ B Day Courses

- A day/B day courses meet on alternating days from August until June.
- One credit is earned for each A Day/B Day course.
- If you choose to take courses offered on the A Day/B Day schedule, you must select an even number of courses.

REGISTERING FOR AP COURSES

The following AP courses are offered on the A day/B day only:

- AP Environmental Science
- AP Human Geography
- AP World History
- AP US Government and Politics
- AP Comparative Government and Politics
- AP Psychology
- AP Statistics
- AP Physics 1

REGISTERING FOR AP COURSES

The following AP courses are year long and you must register for the required companion course:

- AP English Language and Composition,
- AP English Literature and Composition, AP US History, AP Spanish Language and Culture,
- AP German Language and Culture,
- AP French Language and Culture,
- AP Chinese Language and Culture,
- AP Calculus AB, and AP Calculus BC (except for students who have already completed AB).
- AP Computer Science Principles and AP Computer Science A should be taken in the same year.
- The following AP courses are offered as semester courses: AP Macroeconomics, AP Microeconomics, AP Physics 1 and AP Physics 2.

NCVPS / UCV COURSES

- If a course is offered in a face to face setting and a seat is available then students cannot take the online version of that course.
- Union County Virtual (UCV) and the North Carolina Virtual Public School give students an opportunity to take courses that are not offered in a face to face setting.
- Virtual classes are a part of a students daily schedule. Students will report to the distance learning lab during the assigned block. Students taking NCVPS/UCV classes are not permitted to leave school during the virtual block.
- Due to limited virtual allotments, we are not able to offer virtual classes as a 5th block.
- Summer course registration will take place in April; we have limited allotments for summer courses and will assign summer course spots based on a list of priorities determined by the high school principals.

PEER TUTORS - SENIORS ONLY

You can not register to be a peer tutor during registration.


If you want to be a peer tutor, please wait to make this request at the beginning of the appropriate semester. Teacher approval is required.

CAREER AND COLLEGE PROMISE (CCP)

- CCP is a partnership with SPCC that allows Juniors and Seniors to get college credit by taking courses tuition free.
- There are two Pathways:
 - College Transfer Pathway
 - CTE Pathway
- Must have a minimum unweighted GPA of 2.8. If you do not have the unweighted 2.8 GPA, you must have qualifying test scores on the Pre-ACT, PSAT, SAT, ACT or college placement tests.
- Registration for CCP courses will take place in April.
- The new Program Guide can be found here.
- If you have already or are currently taking classes through CCP, you can select up to 2 CCP placeholders for each semester for your course selections. If you have not taken or are not currently enrolled in CCP courses, you MUST register for 8 classes on your registration card EVEN IF you plan to take CCP classes.

To Get Started:

- Visit your high school guidance counselor and confirm your eligibility to participate in the Career and College Promise (CCP) program.
- Log into <u>www.cfnc.org</u> using your personal account information. Access the Application Hub through the Apply To College tab and start an application to South Piedmont Community College.



- The following items are needed to properly complete an application to participate in the Career and College Promise Program:
 - a. CFNC Account Username and Password
 - b. Social Security Number (Not required for immigrants)
 - North Carolina Student Identification Number (PowerSchool Number) Home school students are not required to provide this number.
- 4. Under the Enrollment Information area select:

 Under Career and College Promise Pathways select College Transfer Pathway and/or the Career and Technical Education Pathway. You will also need to select a particular program of study within the selected pathways.

- If your high school uses CFNC for transcripts, you will be asked if you want to send a transcript.
 Simply check the box to send your transcript through CFNC and continue. You can also use the icon shown on the Application Hub in step 2 above to have a transcript sent to a college.
- 7. Finish the application and be sure to select the Submit button.
- 8. Your assigned Enrollment Recruiter will request copies of your qualifying test scores directly from your high school guidance counselor and confirm your eligibility to participate.
- Finally, meet with your assigned Enrollment Recruiter, complete a Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) form, and register for classes within your selected pathway.

Career & Technical Education - Internships

Qualifications

- Senior during school year/rising senior for summer
- Application based (do <u>not</u> register)
- Successfully completed two CTE courses within a pathway
- Minimum of 92% attendance rate
- Reliable transportation

Scheduling

- Minimum of 100 on-site hours (plus weekly assignments)
- Community sponsor and student determine schedule based on the business' hours of operation and convenience

Placements, Assignments, and Grades

- Placements are based on student's interest
- Most assignments are completed online and include journals, terminology, time sheets, and a capstone project
- Grades are based on required assignments, attendance at scheduled meetings, and sponsor evaluations
- Internship grades are shown on report cards and transcripts and used to calculate GPA

FLEX DAY - SENIORS ONLY


- Students who have met all graduation requirements may participate in the flex day program during the second semester of senior year.
- This is only recommended for students who are attending community college or entering the workforce after high school.
- If you are college/university-bound, we recommend you call the university before signing up for flex day.

EARLY GRADUATION


- Seniors have the option to graduate at mid-year if you are able to meet all graduation requirements by the end of first semester (mid-year).
- You must complete an early graduation application by the first ten days of the fall semester.
- It is important for you to check with your college or university before considering this option. Some four year universities do not encourage early graduation.






Click on class registration.

- Here is an example of what you will see when you click on the pencil.
- Click the class and hit okay and continue down
 the page and hit submit.

- Before you submit, make sure you have registered for the appropriate number of classes and that you have all green check marks and no red exclamation points. An exclamation point means that you have some sort of error in your schedule.
- Make sure you check to see which courses you have been recommended for. This is extremely important.
- Again....NO red exclamation points!

WHEN DO I REGISTER?

- You should register independently between now and your appointment time.
 - The ONLINE SYSTEM will LOCK once you meet with a counselor.
- You will meet with a counselor regarding your course selections between March 13th and April 10th. Students who register earlier in the registration process do not have an advantage over those who register later. We are selecting courses during this time, not building schedules.
 - Bring your chromebook, registration card any needed waivers with you to your appointment.

Final Thoughts

- Master Schedule built based off of student registration
- Summer Classes- <u>do not</u> build classes around a particular summer course, select classes you need, we can always change the schedule if a class was completed.
- Schedule Changes- tighter parameters around schedule changes
