Curriculum Information Night – March 9th @ 6:30pm

Learn about offerings such as Advanced Placement courses, College Prep and Honors classes, PR Pathways that focus on careers for all students, Academies at PR, AP Capstone, Graduation Requirements, and opportunities for community college courses.

Step 1: Students complete registration online in PowerSchool by March 13th.

Step 2: Counselors meet with students by 2nd period class March 16th –May 1st to review course requests.

Step 3: Verify and return courses selections signed by parent to 2nd period teacher the following day.

Completing the Course Selections in PowerSchool

Students must select 8 first choice courses (choose the level recommended by your teacher from alert in PowerSchool. Students must follow teacher recommendations in PowerSchool or have a Course Level Change Form signed by parent for a higher level course. Forms must be turned in to your 2nd period teacher.)

•	English	Elective #1
•	Math	Elective #2
•	Science	Elective #3
•	Social Studies	Elective #4

Students must select **4 alternate elective courses** from the alternates group

- Alternate elective courses are backup courses if you do not receive one of your first choice electives.
- · Alternates should be different courses than your first choice courses. Do NOT repeat courses.
- · Alternates should be courses you want to take; review the program of studies for course descriptions.
- Advanced Placement Courses: See back page regarding AP Courses.
- **Prerequisite courses:** required courses that you take before you can take another course. Courses that require a prerequisite will be identified in PowerSchool and the Program of Studies. When you are registering, be certain that you have had the prerequisite course if one is required. **Example: To take Pottery, you should have taken and passed Visual Arts I.**
- **Electives** can be additional courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Arts, World Language, PE, Miscellaneous or Career Technical Education. Information on career pathways at PRHS can be found at https://www.ucps.k12.nc.us/domain/1990.
- World Language recommend students take Level 1 & 2 as close together as possible
 - Native speakers of the language should choose Level 2, if you also read and write it choose Level 3.

Choose your classes and alternates wisely. The choices you make now will most likely be your schedule. We will not make schedule corrections for students who were placed in their 1st choice or alternate course requested.
