#### ACADEMIC DIFFICULTY OF COURSES

- Level 1: College Prep- Course content, pace, and academic rigor follows standards specified by the <u>North Carolina Standard</u> <u>Course of Study</u> (NCSCOS) with content enrichment where appropriate.
- Level 2: Honors- Course content, pace, and academies rigor place high expectations on the student and surpass standards specified by the NCSCOS. These course demand greater independence and responsibility that Level 1 courses. This level is suggested for competitive college admission.
- Level 3: Advanced Placement- Course content, pace, and academic rigor are college-level as adopted by the College Board to prepare students for college.

#### ACADEMIC DIFFICULTY OF COURSES

- Honors: Students must be RECOMMENDED by their current teachers.
   Test scores are also factored into this decision
  - If you are recommended for an honors level course and decide you would rather take the course at the CP level, you may do so.
  - If you are recommended for CP and wish to take honors, your parents should reach out to your teachers and counselor. Students who do this typically struggle in the honors level course.
- **Foundational:** Students who struggle in math and/or English may have the option of a year-long foundational course that will help build necessary skills to be successful.
  - Students will receive 2 credits for these courses upon successful completion.

### REGISTRATION TIMELINE

- Week of Feb 28th:
  - Feb 28th: Registration presentation posted online for parents
  - March 3rd: Homeroom for students- presentation of registration information
- March 1-14: Students work with parents and current teachers to determine best course selection and enter those courses in Powerschool
- March 15-April 1: SVHS counselors meet one-on-one with students to review course selections (bring your worksheet and transcript with you)

#### REGISTRATION PROCESS

#### Registration Presentations

- Posted online and presented in homeroom on March 3rd
- Direct any questions to the question form or to counselors
   who will be in all lunches on March 3rd and 4th.
- Discuss next course in sequence and level options with current teachers
- Put 8 top choices and 4 alternate electives in to powerschool by March 14th.
  - Alternates are just as important as primary choices. More than likely you will be placed in at least one of your alternate choices, so please choose wisely.

#### REGISTRATION PROCESS

#### Entering Course Selections in PowerSchool

- Sign in to PowerSchool through the startup page
- Click "Class Registration" located on the left of the screen
- Click on the pencil icon on the right-hand side of the page next to each course subject listed to choose a course in that subject area
- Once you have selected your course(s), click "okay" and continue to the bottom of the page to hit "Submit"
  - Do this for each core subject (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies)
- Make sure you register for 4 primary and 4 alternate electives


#### ACCESSING THE ONLINE REGISTRATION SYSTEM

 Next, select the pencil icon to the right of each category to view courses in that category.




### ACCESSING THE ONLINE REGISTRATION SYSTEM
