- ★ If you are planning on applying to a four-year college or university, it is a good idea to take either the ACT or the SAT at least **two** times.
- ★ You do **NOT** (and should not) wait until your scores come in to apply to colleges.
- ★ You do **NOT** need to take the SAT or ACT if you are only applying to community colleges.

- ★ You MUST watch deadlines! Each college has their own deadline.
- ★ You MUST list the colleges that you have applied to in your Naviance account.
- ★ You MUST request for your transcript to be sent through your Naviance account so your School Counselor can ensure that it is sent on time!

Charlotte Mecklenburg Emergency Services Scholarship

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Committee, Inc. Scholarship

About: Each year the nonprofit Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Committee, Inc. awards scholarships to one or more high school seniors to support their goals of higher education.

Criteria:

- 1. Official high school transcript
- 2. A copy of your acceptance letter from an accredited college/university or community college
- 3. Three letters of recommendation-two from school personnel and one from a community representative
- 4. Your completed <u>handwritten</u> essay (if your wrote on an additional page, please be sure to include it)
- 5. Application (found in room 117 on scholarship wall)

All applications must be postmarked by Monday, March 2nd 2020.

Winners must be present at their high school awards ceremonies, or the scholarship will be forfeited.

Scholarship winners must supply the MLK Committee with their Student ID numbers and the address of the financial office of the college or university they are attending. Scholarship checks will be mailed directly to the colleges/universities on November 1st, 2020.

2020 Weddington Optimist Computer Scholarship

Computer Scholarship History:

The Weddington Optimist Computer Scholarship has been awarded every spring since 1997. The scholarship started with one school (Sun Valley) and now incorporates eleven Union County High schools.

Deadline: Essays are due on March 6, 2020 at 3:00 pm to Ms. Arias. The scholarship committee will pick 3 essays and will forward them to The Weddington Optimist Club by March 16, 2020.

Winners will be selected by the Weddington Optimist Club by April 3, 2020.

Summary of Important dates:

March 2nd – Essay due to scholarship guidance counselor (this date is flexible per your preference).

March 16th – Essays due to Weddington Optimist Club. This will give us time to review essays before determining the winners.

April 3rd – Winners will be announced to the school's contact.

April 23rd – Scholarship winners' cookout at Weddington Optimists Park. Winner individual plus family and school representative are invited. Headcount will be needed by April 10th.

Union County Educational Office Professional Scholarship

The UCAEOP Scholarship is broken into three (3) separate scholarships. You can receive only one, but you may apply for all that you qualify for. The options are below:

- I am applying for the \$500 Union County EOP Scholarship that is for seniors with a parent who is a member of UCAEOP.
- I am applying for the \$500 UCAEOP Memorial Scholarship that is for seniors who are children of UCPS employees.
- I am applying for the \$500 Billy Stegall Memorial Scholarship that is for any UCPS senior.

NOTE: Effective January 1, 2011, scholarship winners have one (1) calendar year from the date the award is presented to claim their scholarship money; otherwise, the award is forfeited.

National Coalition of 100 Black Women, Inc. Queen City Metropolitan Chapter (QCMC) Scholarship

Purpose:

The National Coalition of 100 Black Women is a nonprofit women's organization. Our mission is to improve the lives of Black women and their families by creating programs focusing on family, education, health, and finances. The QCMC was chartered in Charlotte, NC on September 20, 2009. We endeavor to support the community as well as aspiring young Black women by providing assistance and encouragement to further their education. This is a Merit/Need based Scholarship.

Eligibility:

Scholarship applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a Black woman.
- 2. Be a resident of and senior graduating within the 2019-2020 school year from a high school in one of the following counties, Mecklenburg, Cabarrus, Iredell, Lincoln, Gaston, Union, Lancaster (SC) and York (SC).
- 3. Have a cumulative 2.5 on a 4.0 scale Grade Point Average (GPA) at the time of application.
- 4. Has been accepted to an accredited institution of higher learning, a two or four-year college, university, or technical/vocational school at the time of scholarship application. (Provide evidence of acceptance, i.e., copy of acceptance letter, etc.)

Selection Criteria

The Scholarship Committee will consider the following when selecting scholarship recipients:

- 1. Provide a current copy of the FAFSA for the 2019-2020 school year.
- 2. Be able to document academic achievement during their postsecondary matriculation.
- 3. The recipient of the scholarship must complete 20 hours of documented community service during their postsecondary matriculation.
- 4. Finalists are required to attend a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee. All interviews will be communicated two (2) weeks in advance.

Application Materials:

Scholarship applicants must submit the following information to the QCMC Scholarship Committee before or by March 15th:

- 1. A completed application forms. Incomplete applications will not be considered, no exceptions.
- 2. An official sealed transcript grades submitted with completed application.
- 3. Two sealed letters of recommendation (one reference provided by school personnel and one from a member of the community non-family members).
- 4. A typed 250 words or less statement detailing any personal accomplishments,
- 5. A copy of the applicant's completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or other approved documentation.

Scholarship Awards:

Three (3) awards in the amount of \$1,000.00 (payable in two (2) installments of \$500). The awards will be sent directly to the recipient's school upon verification of enrollment. The awards are non-renewable.

NOTE: Immediate family members of QCMC members are ineligible to apply.

Application Deadline:

The applications, with required materials, must be postmarked before or by March 15th. Pick up applications in Ms. Arias' office. Submit application and required materials via mail to:

Rosa L. Poston and Jeanette B. Sherrod Scholarship

The Rosa L. Poston and Jeanette B. Sherrod Scholarships provide financial assistance to deserving young African-American women who are graduating high school seniors and who will pursue post-secondary education in an accredited four-year college/university.

Eligibility/Criteria:

- 1. Applicant must be senior scheduled to graduate in the spring of the current year.
- 2. Applicant must be a resident of Union County and attend one of the high schools within the Union County Public School District.
- 3. Applicant must submit an acceptance letter from at least one accredited four-year college or university with the application.
- 4. Applicant must have a cumulative grade point average of at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- 5. Applicant must enroll as a full-time student at an accredited 4-year college or university in the fall of 2020.
- 6. Applicant must have leadership potential as evidenced by her school and community activities.

Application Procedures:

To be considered for the Rosa L. Poston or Jeanette B. Sherrod Scholarship, the applicant must:

- 1. Submit a completed application packet with a postmark no later than March 16, 2020 (hand delivered or late packets will not be accepted. The packet must include:
 - a. A completed and signed application form.
 - b. Two letters of recommendation: one from a teacher or school official and the second recommendation from an adult in the community. The letter of recommendation should include, but not be limited to, the length of time reference has known applicant and in what capacity, applicant's strengths and weaknesses, and why the reference believes the applicant deserves the scholarship. The letters of recommendation must be original, signed by the writer, and placed in a sealed envelope.
 - c. A sealed official transcript.
 - d. A typed essay not to exceed 250 words stating why the applicant is applying for the scholarship, her qualifications, education and career goals and why applicant chose the career she intends to pursue.
 - e. A copy of a letter from an accredited four-year college or university verifying acceptance for the fall of 2020.
- 2. Attend a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Union County Alumnae Chapter, if chosen as a finalist.
