Seniors, if you plan on applying for the Morehead-Cain or Park Scholarship, applications are open. Please pick up a nomination form in the counseling department as soon as possible. Nomination forms are due FRIDAY, September 27th at 3pm. You are advised to start on your applications now (separate from nomination form). Do not wait on a school nomination to begin your application! If selected as the school's nominee you will have the opportunity to change your status. Student nominations will be submitted to the Scholarship Committee. Students please prepare a resume to submit along with your nomination form. YOU DO NOT HAVE TO BE NOMINATED TO APPLY FOR EITHER SCHOLARSHIP. Good luck!

You will only need to submit one copy of your resume regardless of how many scholarships you will apply to for school nominations. A copy of your resume will be kept on file in school counseling office.

NC State Park Scholarships

The Park Scholarships Program has a unique mission to make an important difference in the quality of the undergraduate culture at NC State while also having a tangible impact on the leaders it prepares. Park Scholars are selected based on four criteria: scholarship, leadership, service, and character. The four-year award is valued at \$111,000 for in state students, including the full cost of education/tuition & fees, and funding for a personal computer, educational trips, retreats, seminars, and grant opportunities. ** Any student is welcome to apply on their own; however WHS will be nominating 2 students. If you are not nominated, you may apply by visiting www.ncsu.edu/park_scholarships. If you would like to receive school nomination please pick up nomination form in guidance. Nomination forms are due by 9/27/19. Nominated students will be notified by 10/02/19. Students may self-nominate through NOVEMBER 1, 2019. Questions can be directed to park_scholars@ncsu.edu.

The Morehead-Cain Scholarship

Long considered the nation's premier undergraduate scholarship program, the Morehead-Cain offers dynamic young leaders a lifelong challenge to make a difference in the world. Eligibility is based on leadership, scholarship, moral force of character, and physical vigor. WHS will be nominating 3 students this year. If you wish to be considered for nomination, please pick up a nomination form in the counseling department. Nomination forms due 9/27/19 to Mrs. Washington. Nominated students will be notified 10/02/19. **Applicants are NOT ALLOWED to apply binding Early Decision to any university (students may apply Early Action). Any student is welcome to apply on their own; apply by visiting http://moreheadcain.org/apply. The deadline is October 15th.

<u>Davidson College: Lowell L. Bryan Scholars Program (Athletic)</u>

Valued at \$30,000.00 annually and renewable for four years. Bryan Scholarship finalists not named as winners are named Davidson Scholars. Criteria: This program honors scholar athletes who have potential to be strong leaders both in the classroom and in their sports. Two Bryan Scholars, one female and one male, are chosen for each incoming class. WHS may nominate up to three students. Candidates are chosen on the basis of academic and personal excellence; strong promise of significant impact in their classes and in their lives on campus; and potential for success in Davidson's NCAA Division I athletic program. How to Apply: Please pick up a nomination form to submit to Mrs. Washington along with a resume and to check the list of eligible sports by Friday, **October 4th 2019**. The Davidson College admissions application must be

submitted by the student prior to October 15th, 2019.

<u>Davidson College: John Montgomery Belk Scholarship</u>T

This scholarship is awarded for Academic excellence, enthusiasm, integrity, and leadership ability and potential. The Belk four-year scholarship covering tuition, fees, room and board is valued at \$67,794 and includes 2 special study abroad stipends for \$3000 each as well as other enrichment opportunities. *Requirements:* High academics and above average test scores, exceptional promise in academics, character, leadership, athletics, and community service. Nomination materials are available at www.davidson.edu/belk and due to Mrs. Washington by **October 15, 2019**. This will include nomination form along with a resume. Nominations will be notified and submitted to Davidson on **November 1st, 2019**. Nominees must submit a completed admission application no later than **November 22, 2019**. This does not imply Early Decision commitment - it is simply an early completion date.

P.E.O. Star Scholarship

This is a non-renewable \$2500 scholarship for graduating high school senior women which must be used in the academic year following graduation or it will be forfeited. When a chapter identifies a prospective applicant, the local STAR chairman will arrange an interview to assess eligibility. <u>University of Virginia – Jefferson Scholars Foundation</u>

The goal of the foundation is to attract the most outstanding students in the nation and the world to the University, students who are extraordinary leaders, scholars, and citizens. Individual merit in these three areas is the sole criterion for selection. Financial need is not a consideration in making nominations, recommendations, or selections. The program covers the actual reported cost of attendance, including tuition, room, board, books and miscellaneous expenses. The Levine Scholars Program - UNC Charlotte

The Levine Scholars Program takes the brightest, most capable students and gives them the tools, resources and environment they need to connect, transform and make a difference in the world. The four-year scholarship includes full tuition, room and board, a grant to implement a service project of the Scholar's own design, and four summers of experiences that will develop leadership skills, social awareness, and an international perspective. **To apply, students must be nominated online by their school counselor. There are no limitations to the number of students who can be nominated from each high school.

Students are unable to nominate themselves for this program. Once students have been nominated by their school official, they will receive an email directing them to the Levine Scholars Portal where they will find the supplemental scholarship application and essay questions. Students should complete the "recommenders section" immediately so that emails can be sent to those people.

If you are interested in being nominated, please email Mrs. Washingtoin in guidance no later than *October 4th, 2019*. Please submit a nomination form (you do NOT need to submit a resume for Levine scholarship). The nominee's deadline for applying to UNC Charlotte is November 1st, 2019 and the deadline for the Levine Supplemental application is November 8th, 2019.

United States Senate Youth Program

The United States Senate Youth Program is a scholarship program that provides an educational opportunity for juniors and seniors interested in pursuing college coursework in history or political science. Student delegates winning the \$10,000 scholarship and attending the week-long event in Washington, D.C. in March 2019 will hear major policy addresses by Senators, cabinet members and directors from other

Competitive applicants demonstrate high academic achievement, strong leadership qualities, involvement in extracurricular activities and civic engagement and an interest in textile-related careers. The Thomas Wolfe Scholarship award will be based largely on written work submitted by candidates. Artistic merit is the chief criterion of selection. Students who write poetry, fiction, plays, literary non-fiction (personal narratives, memoir, travel and nature essays, literary journalism, belles-lettres) are eligible. Multiple genre submissions are also encouraged, though submissions are limited to one application per student. Thomas Wolfe Scholarship applicants must apply to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill by the University's **October 15th, 2019** early admission deadline and must meet all academic requirements for early admission. Completion of the Thomas Wolfe Scholarship is due **November 15th, 2019**.
