The school improvement goals were reviewed. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Safety - The first goal is to improve and align schoolwide management and practices.</li> <li>● The second goal is to decrease minor office referrals.</li> <li>● We have decreased overall minor referrals from 67 at this time last year to 40 now. The major referrals have also decreased.</li> <li>● Overall, the school has met this goal.</li> <li>● Academics - The goal is to enhance K-5 core instructional practices and</li> </ul>

		<p>enhance small group support to intervene and enrich students.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● We are increasing our percentages. MOY mclass “above grade level” in 2024 was 52%. This year it is 59%.</li><li>● MOY iReady “above grade level” - In 2024 - 41% met this. In 2025 - 48% met this.</li><li>● Culture - We want to increase exposure to relevant /real world experiences for students. Each grade level has completed one service project. We have one more service project to complete.</li><li>● The mClass data was reviewed. There was an increase in scores from the beginning of the year to the middle of year in most grade levels.</li><li>● The NC Check In data was shared for the percentage of students who scored at 60% or higher.</li><li>● The iReady Math data was reviewed. There was an increase in every grade level from the beginning of year to the middle of year.</li><li>● The NC Math Check In data was reviewed.</li><li>● The NC Science Check In was reviewed. We do not yet have MOY data for each grade level.</li></ul>
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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The teacher survey results were reviewed.</li> <li>• Data for BT teachers was reviewed.</li> <li>• Career and College Ready data was reviewed.</li> <li>• Our team discussed how we would like to have iReady available for students to practice their skills with. Some teachers wondered if this would help students when they take iReady assessments.</li> </ul>

This was based on scoring 60% or higher on the check in.</p> <p>Reading CCR: 3rd grade has 38%. 4th grade has 57%. 5th grade has 50%</p> <p>Math: Currently, 66% are proficient in 3rd grade. 78% are proficient in 4th grade. 91% are proficient in 5th grade.</p> <p>Math CCR: 3rd grade has 33%. 4th grade has 41%. 5th grade has 62%.</p> <p>The check ins are showing that we are progressing toward our goal.</p>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● mClass and iReady</li><li>● mClass goals reviewed</li><li>● EOG data will be looked at for grades 3, 4, 5</li><li>● Check-In data to be added soon (November, December)</li><li>● Goals were created by adding 5 points to where the grade level was at the end of last year.</li> <li>● Noticed that data was high in mClass for K-3 and was lower in 4-5</li><li>● Question presented about the lower data in those grades</li><li>● 3rd grade fluency was a concern -This is a timed piece.</li><li>● If there is a portion tested on mClass it should also be practiced to help the student be familiar with this type of assessment. For example, allow students to read aloud to the teacher.</li> <li>● Question: Who decides on the math curriculum?
