5% Learning to read seems effortless

35% Learning to read is relatively easy with broad instruction

40 to 50%

Learning to read proficiently requires code-based explicit, systematic, and sequential instruction

10 to 15 % (Dyslexia)

Learning to read requires code-based explicit/systematic/sequential/diagnostic instruction with many repetitions

Advantaged by a structured literacy approach

Reading is unnatural.

Our brains are "wired" for language, but not for reading.

Learning to read involves training the brain.

- Sound-letter correspondence
- Words
- Sentences
- Paragraphs
- Morphemes (meaningful parts)

Skilled readers use different parts of the brain than

unskilled readers.

Brain imaging research shows that after just two months of explicit and systematic instruction, unskilled reading brains can be "rewired".






How can I help?



Instead of this	Do this
"Does it look right?" "Does it sound right?" "Does it make sense?"	"What sounds do you <u>see</u> ? Start at the beginning and work all the way through the word."
	"Sound it out."
	"What rule goes with this spelling?"
	"What chunks of the word do you already know?"
"Look at the picture. What in the picture starts with this sound?"	"How does this show what's happening in the story?"
"What is my child's reading level?"	"What are the reading skills my child is working on?"

How can I support my reader at home?

- Vocabulary
- Language Structure
- Background Knowledge
- Have intentional conversations: Ask questions. Make connections.
- Provide wide variety of experiences.
- Encourage reading that the child enjoys and support when needed.
