Good evening, Parkwood Wolf Pack families,

We've had two great days of exams so far! Two more to go! Monday and Tuesday (1/22/2024 and 1/23/2024) will be regular exam days. Wednesday (1/24/2024) is a makeup exam day. We will begin exams promptly at 8:30 am and will continue until all students have completed their exams. Students will be dismissed from school on those days after ALL exams have been completed. While the estimated time will be around 12:45, THIS IS ONLY AN ESTIMATE. Many factors go into students completing their exams and we always encourage them to take their time and be sure about their answers.

Second semester begins Friday, January 26. If your student needs a schedule correction (for example: they failed a class in the first semester that's a prerequisite), they need to fill out this Google form for their counselor: <u>https://bit.ly/PWHSSp24SchCorReq</u>

Students must be logged in to their school google account.

Deadline to request a schedule correction is Friday, February 1, 2024 at 3:30 pm. Requests will only be considered for the following reasons:

- Senior is missing a required class for graduation or college admission
- Student has not met or is missing a prerequisite for a course in which they are enrolled
- · Student is taking a course that he/she has passed
- Students is missing a required core course (English, Math, Science, Social Studies)
- Level change in a core class (for example: Honors to CP only if there is space available in the other class)

If a student's request cannot be made, they will receive a message through their school email. If the request can be made, a counselor will meet with the student to change the schedule.


