

Brinkley-Lane Scholars is the most prestigious undergraduate award program offered at East Carolina University. Housed in the Honors College, the four-year merit scholarship recognizes out standing academic performance, commitment to community engagement and strong leadership skills. Recipients receive a fully funded education, covering the cost of tuition, fees, room and board for both instate and out of state students and high impact experiences, as well as the ability to explore the world with a \$5,000 study abroad stipend.



The Cheatham-White Scholarship is a merit-based scholarship program for students attending North Carolina Central University. This program was designed to provide an outstanding educational experience for exceptional scholars with a wide range of interests. Students chosen for the Cheatham-White Scholarship typically are proficient in both the arts and sciences, demonstrate strong leadership potential, and have a commitment to public service.



The Levine Scholars Program is UNC Charlotte's premier merit scholarship. As a program grounded in civic engagement, the Levine Scholarship not only covers the full cost of attendance, it also awards scholars a grant to implement a community service project. Scholars develop into transformational leaders through funded experiences that include a non-profit internship, study abroad, a pre-professional internship, and individualized mentorship.



The Park Scholarships is NC State University's premier four-year merit scholarship program. Beyond covering the full cost of attending NC State, it affords Park Scholars access to a vibrant community of peers and alumni; horizon-expanding trips, retreats, service opportunities, and leadership training; individualized faculty mentoring; early course registration; and grants to fund professional and personal enrichment experiences such as study abroad and research projects.


Junior/Senior Prom

Quick Notes from the Counselors

ASVAB

Wednesday, Nov 15, 2023 from 8:30-11:30am.

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) measures aptitude and acquired skills which can be used to help predict future academic and occupational success. ASVAB scores give students insight into their options and aid them in planning their next step after high school. The ASVAB is also used by the military for enlistment and classification.

Must be in 10th, 11th or 12th grade to take the test. The test will be on computer and takes about 2 1/2 hours.

SPCC

Students in 11th & 12th grade who meet eligibility requirements may take college classes at SPCC. Must have a minimum 2.8 unweighted GPA or higher.

SPCC Career and College Promise Program



CCP is a North Carolina dual enrollment program that allows students to take college courses **tuition-free** while enrolled in high school. Students are responsible for additional costs, like ebooks, supplies and online access codes. UCPS school districts provides a \$50 reimbursement per course (see link below). The program's design provides structured opportunities for high school students to earn college credits tuition-free that "lead to a certificate, diploma, or degree as well as provide entry-level jobs skills. Career and College Promise is designed to connect students to college

and career goals, whether they intend to transfer or go directly into the workforce after high school graduation.

Eligible students can choose between different pathways under CCP:

- College Transfer Pathways (CTP): <u>tuition-free</u> courses toward a number of transfer degrees, including the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science.
- Career and Technical Education (CTE) Pathways: <u>tuition-free</u> courses toward a certificate or diploma in Welding, Construction, IT, Health Sciences, Automotive. These include Workforce Continuing Education (WCE) courses that can lead to a state or industry-recognized credential.

Eligibility requirements vary between pathways but typically consider a student's grade level, unweighted GPA, or college readiness through an assessment.

Ms. Davis, is our SPCC Career Coach assigned to Parkwood students. She is on-site available to students on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays of each week during the school day. She is located in the Media Center (700 bldg.) and available during the lunch blocks for student access and can be reached @ wdavis@spcc.edu or 704-290-5876.

Mrs. Davison is our Counselor at Parkwood who works with students interested in taking college classes. Students can reach out to her through email shari.davison@ucps.k12.nc.us or the counselor meeting request form on how the program works with their high school classes.


