## 2024–2025 Student Schedules

PowerSchool will open for students on Friday, August 16, 2024. Students will be able to see their schedules at this time.

Please use this link to access the form for schedule corrections. The form will open on Tuesday 8/20/2024 at 5:00 pm.

Deadline to request a schedule correction is Friday, August 30, 2024 at 3:30 pm

Requests for both 1st and 2nd semester should be made at this time. All corrections must be requested on the same submission. Only one request (form entry) will be allowed per student.

All schedules have been reviewed. Changes will not be made for students who were placed in their 1st or alternate choice courses requested.

Requests will only be considered for the following reasons:

- Senior is missing a required class for graduation or for college admissions
- Student has not met or is missing a prerequisite for a course for which they are enrolled
- Student is taking a course that he/she has already passed
- Student is missing a required core course (English, Math, Science, Social Studies) in their schedule
- Student has the same course listed twice on their schedule
- Level change in core class (ie. Honors to CP only if there is space available in the new level course)
- Student has "Please See Your Counselor" listed on their schedule

A counselor will email you as we are able to process your request at your UCPS school email whether a correction can or cannot be made to your schedule. Counselors will not be responding to schedule requests made by email or by phone.

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## PSAT/NMSQT for Juniors

## PSAT/ NMSQT



Current juniors have the opportunity to sign up to take the PSAT/NMSQT, which is the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test and practice for the SAT test. This is optional for junior and they must sign up to take it. The PSAT will be given at the end of October during the school day. UCPS will pay for current juniors only to take the exam. The deadline to sign up is August 29th. Juniors must sign up at this link. Please note that students must be logged in to their school Google account to access the form.

Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, NC Senate Bill 193 requires that <u>all</u> students in grades 6-12 have a career plan. A student's initial career plan will be created by the end of their 6th grade year and then revised annually through 12th grade. 

#### **Gateway Scholarship FAQs**

- Our admission application is FREE. There is no separate application for the scholarship. High school students should submit our first-year undergraduate application. High school graduates (those who completed community college courses after graduating from high school) should use the transfer-student application.
- . The scholarship is for up to 4 years (8 semesters) at Wingate as long as students maintain a GPA consistent with our academic standards.
- The scholarship is applied to a student's financial aid after all other institutional, federal and state aid have been applied toward tuition.
- · The scholarship can be used for any undergraduate orogram (not just certain majors.)
- Scholarship recipients are responsible for the costs of room, board and a meal plan if they live on campus (average additional cost of \$10K per year).
- . The scholarship is not limited to a certain number of recipients each year. Any student who meets the qualifications is eligible.
- · Although it is not an income-based scholarship families are required to complete the FAFSA or a financial responsibility form, to be eligible.
- . Students must be enrolled full-time at Wingate (12 or more credit hours) to receive the scholarship.
