Union County Public Schools (UCPS) is committed to ensuring that all students receive a quality education in safe and efficient learning environments.

On Nov. 5, Union County residents will vote on \$39,421,448 in school bonds. This bond package will address aging facilities at Parkwood High and East Union Middle. The schools were built in the 1950s and 1960s, and are inadequate for modern-day teaching and learning.

This bond will invest in pre-construction for a new Parkwood High School and a construction project that will relocate East Union Middle to the Forest Hills High campus. The 2024 bond will build on previous commitments and investments to provide modern schools for our students. For Parkwood High, the funding will address design work, assessments and land surveys. For the East Union Middle project, the funding will provide demolition, additions and building renovations to accommodate middle school academic and athletic programming.

With a successful bond, more projects will move up on the priority list for capital needs and future bonds. All communities benefit when we value public schools. District improvements increase safety, support evolving educational programs and practices, modernize aging facilities and directly impact the quality of life in Union County.

Career and College Promise Information

Career & College Promise Program

The Career and College Promise Program allows high school students who qualify to enroll in community college courses while still attending their home school. These courses can be used for dual credit in order to meet high school graduation requirements as well as accumulating towards an associate's degree or as a plan to meet general education requirements in the college or university setting. Union County Public Schools coordinate through South Piedmont Community College for this dual enrollment experience.

- 11th & 12th grade students must have at least a 2.8 unweighted GPA to qualify for the program. There are two types of pathways students can choose: Career and Technical and/or College Transfer.
- 9th & 10th may only take a few Career Technical Pathways that do not have transferable classes to 4 year colleges. Must meet certain eligibility requirements.
- Students are required to pay for \$60 per course for ebooks. UCPS will reimburse currently enrolled UCPS students up to \$50 per CCP course for approved ebooks. Students facing financial hardship can contact Mrs. Davison in counseling for additional options.
- Tuition is paid for by the state of NC. There is no tuition cost for students.

Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, NC Senate Bill 193 requires that <u>all</u> students in grades 6-12 have a career plan. A student's initial career plan will be created by the end of their 6th grade year and then revised annually through 12th grade. 
