- We need to share some GREAT information about Parkwood High School's School Performance Grade. Each high school in North Carolina receives an overall grade for the school's performance each year. This year, I'm very proud to announce that our students and teachers are **AMAZING** (no surprise there). Overall, our School Performance Grade increased from 74 to 75! Our grade of B keeps getting stronger!
- <u>Parents Absent Notes:</u> All parent absent notes for this six weeks is due <u>Friday, October 4th.</u> Remember, you must turn in parent written notes within the six weeks grading period.
- Parents of student drivers: Please note that, according to the Student Parking Application, students are held accountable for their unexcused tardies which also impacts their parking privileges. Since your students drive themselves to school, they are in control of when they arrive. When students reach 3 tardies, they receive a lunch detention. In addition to this, assistant principals will be calling parents to notify them of their students' habitual tardiness. Upon their 6th tardy, students will lose their driving privileges for 5 days. Every increment of 3 tardies beyond 6, students will also lose their driving privileges for 5 days. Please ensure that your students are getting to school and to class on time eerie day. It is also imperative that they leave home on time in order to be able to drive safely to school every day.

UCPS 2024 Bond Vote

COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

NOV. 5

Union County Public Schools (UCPS) is committed to ensuring that all students receive a quality education in safe and efficient learning environments.

On Nov. 5, Union County residents will vote on \$39,421,448 in school bonds. This bond package will address aging facilities at Parkwood High and East Union Middle. The schools were built in the 1950s and 1960s, and are inadequate for modern-day teaching and learning.

This bond will invest in pre-construction for a new Parkwood High School and a construction project that will relocate East Union Middle to the Forest Hills High campus. The 2024 bond will build on previous commitments and investments to provide modern schools for our students. For Parkwood High, the funding will address design work, assessments and land surveys. For the East Union Middle project, the funding will provide demolition, additions and building renovations to accommodate middle school academic and athletic programming.

With a successful bond, more projects will move up on the priority list for capital needs and future bonds. All communities benefit when we value public schools. District improvements increase safety, support evolving educational programs and practices, modernize aging facilities and directly impact the quality of life in Union County.

El 5 de noviembre, los residentes del Condado Union votarán acerca de \$39,421,448 en bonos escolares. Este paquete de bonos abordará las instalaciones antiguas de Parkwood High y de East Union Middle. Las escuelas fueron construidas en las décadas de 1950 y 1960 y son inadecuadas para la enseñanza y el aprendizaje de hoy en día.

Este bono se invertirá en la preconstrucción de una nueva escuela secundaria Parkwood High y en un proyecto de construcción que trasladará East Union Middle al campus de Forest Hills High. El bono 2024 se basará en compromisos e inversiones anteriores para proporcionar escuelas modernas a nuestros estudiantes. Para Parkwood High, los fondos se destinarán al trabajo de diseño, evaluaciones y estudios topográficos. Para el proyecto East Union Middle, los fondos proporcionarán demolición, ampliaciones y renovaciones de edificios para dar cabida a los programas académicos y deportivos de la escuela intermedia.

Con un bono exitoso, más proyectos ascenderán en la lista de prioridades para necesidades de capital y bonos futuros. Todas las comunidades se benefician cuando valoramos las escuelas públicas. 

Career and College Promise Information

Career & College Promise Program

The Career and College Promise Program allows high school students who qualify to enroll in community college courses while still attending their home school. These courses can be used for dual credit in order to meet high school graduation requirements as well as accumulating towards an associate's degree or as a plan to meet general education requirements in the college or university setting. Union County Public Schools coordinate through South Piedmont Community College for this dual enrollment experience.

- 11th & 12th grade students must have at least a 2.8 unweighted GPA to qualify for the program. There are two types of pathways students can choose: Career and Technical and/or College Transfer.
- 9th & 10th may only take a few Career Technical Pathways that do not have transferable classes to 4 year colleges. Must meet certain eligibility requirements.
- Students are required to pay for \$60 per course for ebooks. UCPS will reimburse currently enrolled UCPS students up to \$50 per CCP course for approved ebooks. Students facing financial hardship can contact Mrs. Davison in counseling for additional options.
- Tuition is paid for by the state of NC. There is no tuition cost for students.


