Statement of Purpose:

7. Soliciting parents' suggestions in the planning, development, and operation of the program
8. Consulting with parents about how the school can work with parents to achieve the program's objectives
9. Providing timely responses to parents' recommendations
10. Facilitating participation by parents in school activities
11. Notifying all parents in the Union County Public Schools' District of the Annual Parent Engagement (Public Hearing) Meeting
12. Providing system and school report cards to document academic performance on a yearly basis, to include the Annual Report to the People of Union County
13. Evaluating annually the process of parent/community engagement to specifically look at barriers, level of involvement, and strategies to increase engagement of all populations
14. Maintaining a parent advisory council to help facilitate parent involvement ideas and activities
