What is dual language learning?

Language immersion programs are exciting options for parents who want their children to experience a rigorous academic program while also learning two languages — English and a target language. For example, in a Spanish immersion program, Spanish is not a subject; Spanish is the language in which instruction is delivered.





Advantages as a dual language student

Bilingual and biliterate: Dual language students achieve high proficiency in the target language.

Increased cultural understanding: Dual language students learn a philosophy of diversity and inclusion.

Enhanced cognitive skills: Dual language students typically develop greater cognitive flexibility, showing increased memory, superior problem-solving skills, and better attention control as well as an enhanced understanding of their primary language. **Improved self-esteem:** Being able to communicate and excel academically in two languages gives dual language students greater self-esteem and sense of accomplishment.

Proven performance on standardized tests: Dual language students show great gains and increased performance on standardized tests in reading and math.

Preparation for a global society and marketplace: Dual language students are better prepared to be leaders in a global community and to succeed in the 21st century marketplace.
