# Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

- ESSA is the federal law that allows states to develop their own plan/model to meet federal testing and accountability requirements.
- ➤ US Department of Education Waivers
  - ✓ 2019-20 School Year waivers granted
    - EOY Testing waived
  - EOY Accountability waived
  - ✓ 2020-21 School Year partial waivers granted
  - EOY Testing not waived
  - EOY Accountability waived
  - ✓ 2021-22 School Year no waivers granted
  - ✓ 2022-23 School Year no waivers granted

# North Carolina Accountability Model Components

#### **≻EOG** and EOC Scoring

- ✓ **Not Proficient** (previously Level 1 & 2)
  - Limited or partial command of subject matter
- ✓ Grade Level Proficient GLP (Levels 3 and above)
  - ■Sufficient command of subject matter.
  - ■Used for calculating state accountability measures (e.g., School Performance Grades)
  - ■Included in all accountability reporting and NC School Report Cards
- ✓ Career and College Readiness CCR (Levels 4 and 5)
  - ■Suggests the student is on-track to be college and/or career ready upon graduation.
  - ■Used for calculating federal accountability measures (e.g., Long-Term Goals).
  - •Included in all accountability reporting and NC School Report Cards




- The 2021-22 ACT proficiency data point would have been 70.2%.

#### > <u>Achievement Score</u> – Proficiency Composite

✓ Grade Level Proficient (GLP; % at Achievement Levels 3, 4, & 5).

#### **Growth Score** − Growth Composite - EVAAS

- ✓ An indication of the rate students learned over the past year for the school as a whole. The standard is roughly equivalent to a year's worth of academic growth for a year of instruction.
- ✓ Based on calculations, schools are given a designation of:
  - Exceeded Expected Growth
  - Met Expected Growth
- Did Not Meet Expected Growth

#### > Low Performing Schools

- ✓ An area from last year's EOY presentation as a "Next Step" for intervention:
  - "Reduce the number of schools identified as Low Performing."

- ➤ UCPS decreased the number of *Low Performing* schools from 13 (2021-22) to 7 (2022-23), a decease of 46.2%.
  - ✓ Change in the % of *Low Performing* schools, by district (in comparison to the 12 Large NC districts)
    - #1 Union County Public Schools, 46.2%, from 13 to 7
    - #2 New Hanover County Schools, 41.7%, from 12 to 7
    - #3 Gaston County Schools, 33.3%, from 27 to 18
    - #4 Onslow County Schools, 22.2%, from 18 to 14
    - #5 Forsyth County Schools, 17.1%, from 35 to 29




# Academic Results, K-2 Reading Proficiency

# Impact of Intensive Tutoring



- ➤UCPS Areas of "Rebound"
  - ✓ Rebound = at least within 1.5 percentage points of proficiency from 2018-19
    - ■Math EOG, Grade 3
    - ■Math EOG, Grade 4
    - ■High School EOC, NC Math 3
    - ■High School EOC, English II
    - ■High School, Math Course Rigor\*\*
    - High School, Cohort Graduation Rate\*\*
    - ■CTE Credentials Earned\*\*
    - ■AP Exams Taken & Pass Rate\*\*



## **Key Accomplishments**

- ➤UCPS Overall Proficiency on state assessments (69.3%) was ranked highest among the state's 12 largest school districts and was ranked #2 across the entire state (#1 was Chapel Hill-Carrboro, 71.1%).
- >UCPS ranked #1 among the state's 12 largest districts with regard to:
  - ✓ 3-8 math EOGs, 3-8 reading EOGs, 5 & 8 science EOGs, all EOGs combined, all EOCs combined, overall proficiency, 4-year Cohort Graduation Rate, and ACT/WorkKeys combined.
- > UCPS was ranked #2 on ACT proficiency (56.8%) (#1 was Wake County Schools, 57.8%)



## Key Accomplishments (continued)

- ▶84% of schools earned a *School Performance Grade* of A, B, or C, up from 74% last school year.
- ➤84% of schools either met or exceeded expected growth, up from 60% last school year.
- ➤ Proficiency has returned to pre-pandemic levels in 8 academic and college/career readiness areas.
- The total number of CTE credentials earned, AP exams taken, and the AP exampass rate, were the highest in UCPS history.
- ➤ Proficiency data shows the positive impact from intensive tutoring programs in 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 7<sup>th</sup> grades.



## Next Steps

- ➤ Continue to focus on academic performance to:
  - ✓ Further decrease the number of schools not meeting growth.
  - ✓ Further decrease the number of schools identified as Low Performing.
  - ✓ Increase grade level proficiency (GLP) and growth across all middle schools.
- Continue the district's turnaround plan for schools identified as Focus schools for the 2023-24 school year.



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
